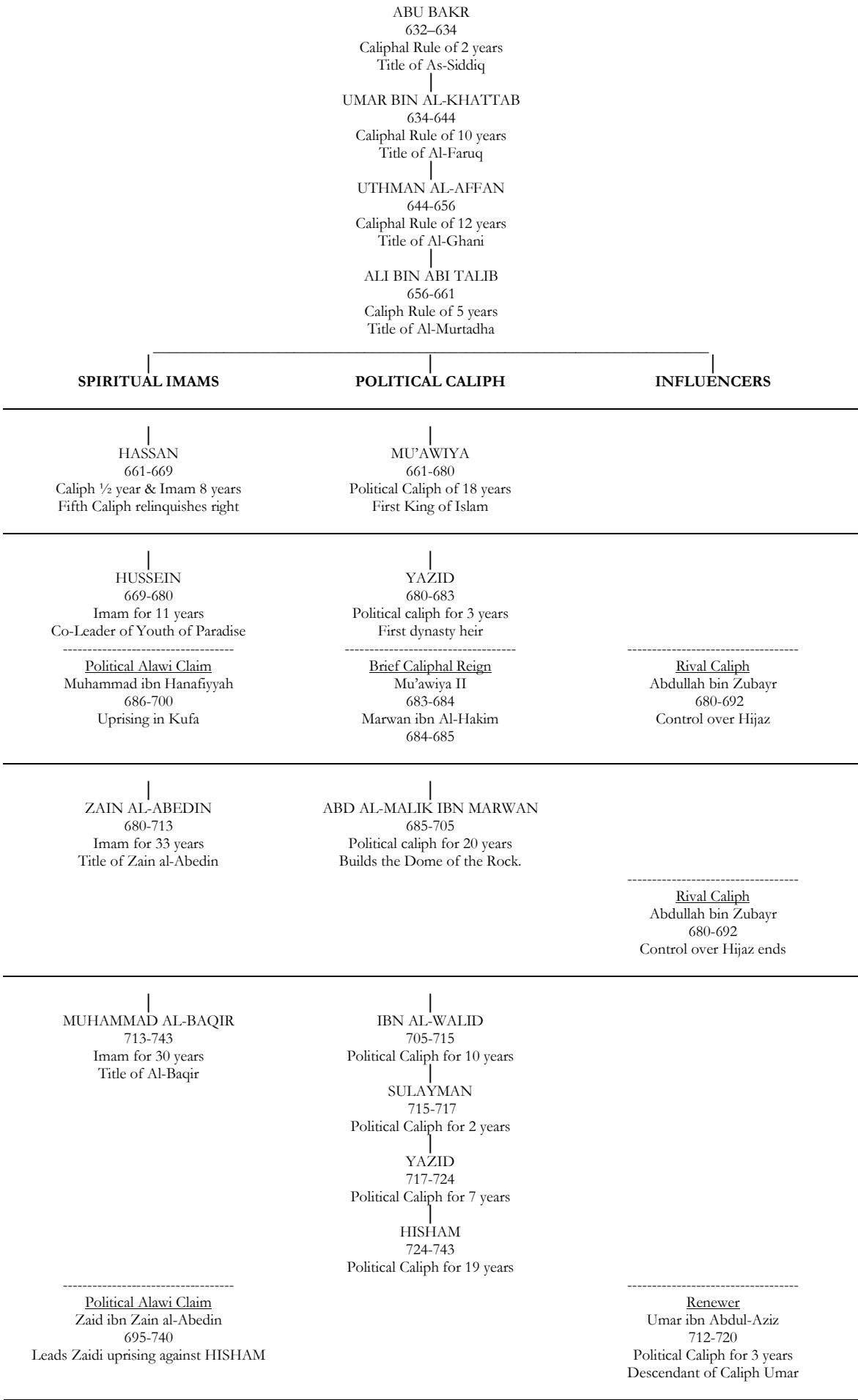


THE TWELVE LEADERS OF QURAISH

Political Caliph for 20 years

799-818
Imam for 19 years
Title of Al-Rida
Al-Mamun's heir apparent, but dies

Harun al-Rashid
786-809
Political Caliph for 25 years

Al-Amin
809-813
Political Caliph for 4 years

Al-Ma'mun
813-833
Political Caliph for 20 years

THERE WILL BE 12 MUSLIM LEADERS - ALL OF THEM WILL BE FROM QURAISH THE PROPHET MUHAMMAD (BUKHARI)

- All Capitalised names refer to either the 4 Caliphs who took The Right Way, the 7 Spiritual Imams or 8 Political Caliphs
- The Best Muslims were the Caliphs who took The Right Way and the Spiritual Imams
- Spiritual and political leadership in one Muslim was present in the Caliphs who took the Right way and then split
- The appointment of the Spiritual Imam Ali as the heir apparent to Al-Ma'mun was the last opportunity in past history for the highest spiritual and political power to be combined in one Muslim
- Spiritual Imams are all direct descendants of the Prophet and Ali ibn Abi Talib
- Spiritual Imamate held by 8
- Political Caliphate held by 21
- Alawi uprisings are 3
- For each Spiritual Imam, there were three Political Leaders
- Renewer of the First Islamic Century was Umar ibn Abdul-Aziz
